BENEFITS OF MR/US FUSION-GUIDED PROSTATE BIOPSY

Prostate MR images taken can potentially identify specific areas within the gland that are suspicious and require further evaluation.

Performing biopsy with MR/US fusion holds the potential to target the suspicious areas, reduces the number of tissue samples acquired, and thus may reduce risk of false negatives, infection, bleeding, pain and recovery time.

- Patients with positive digital rectal examination (DRE) and a negative transrectal ultrasound guided TRUS biopsy
- Patients requiring prostate surgery or radiation therapy

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM PROSTATE MRI?

Diagnostic MRI Imaging Process: Prostate MRI is a noninvasive imaging technique that does not utilize exposure to ionizing radiation.

- When receiving an MRI, patients are positioned on a examination table integrated with MRI system.
- When the examination is completed, patients may be asked to wait until the images are processed in the event additional scans are required.
- MRI exams generally include multiple scans (sequences), some of which may last several minutes.

The entire exam is usually completed in 45

minutes.
